




Faculty of the week: Science & Computing



A Librarian's Tale

As a Librarian, all too many times I hear the words, 'I don't like reading' and 'Books are rubbish' from children. This is so sad to hear as reading is not just an important skill for life, but for those of us who love to read, it is a source of hours of inexpensive, peaceful enjoyment.

The school requirement is for 70 minutes reading per week, of which 30 – 40 minutes takes place during English lessons, and the rest at home. In order to encourage and develop reading skills it is really important that pupils choose books which will engage them.

Often reluctant readers tend to choose titles they remember from primary school, like 'Horrid Henry' or 'Timmy Failure'. No wonder they are not inspired them to read if they continue to choose books designed for much younger readers! To address this, a large sum has been invested in the library, primarily on good quality fiction for teenagers and young adults of all age groups and tastes within school and I am pleased to say that they have been received with great enthusiasm by the pupils.

They make excellent stocking fillers for Christmas and seeing the pleasure on the faces of our Year 7 pupils when they recently received their free books reminded me that giving books as gifts could be a tradition we can revive!
