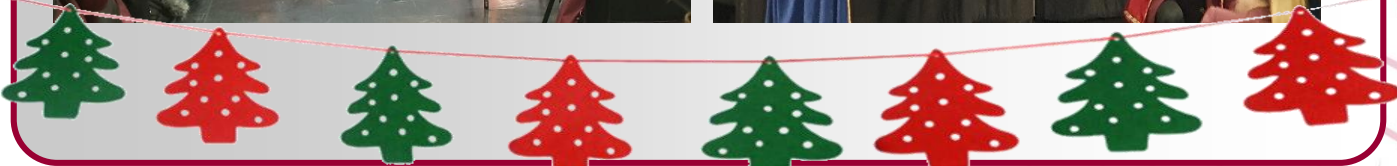

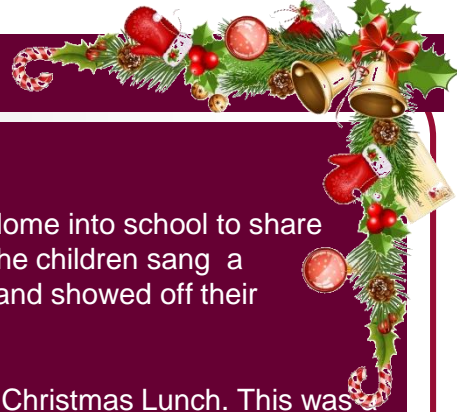
Take Two Theatre Company

On Tuesday all Dean Trust Rose Bridge children received a traditional Christmas Dinner lovingly prepared and delivered by our amazing Kitchen staff.

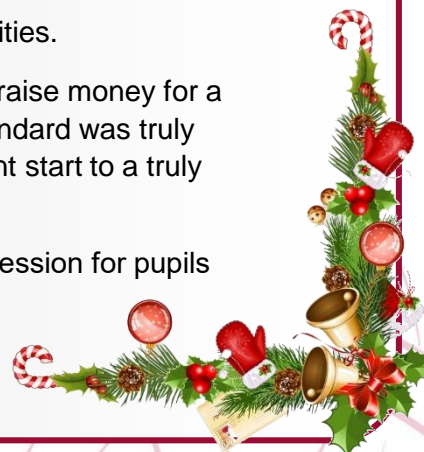
