Have a great weekend.

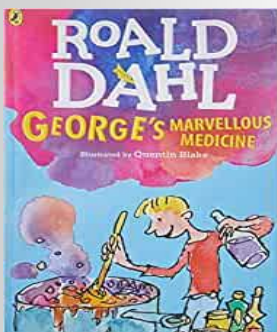

## WEEKLY MATHS PROBLEM

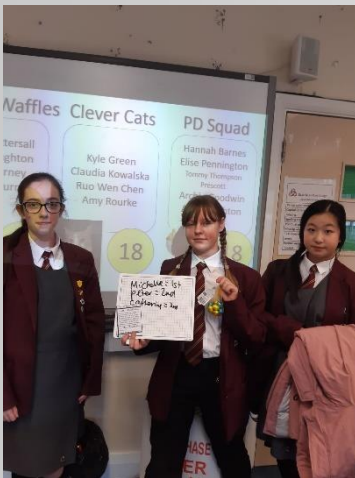

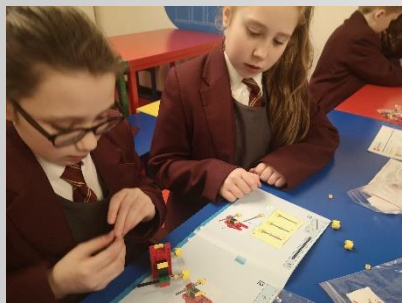




# Faculty of the week: Mathematics

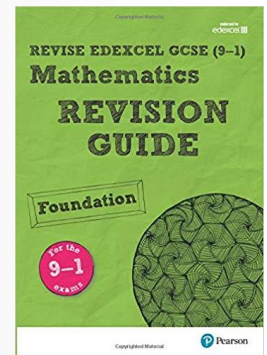
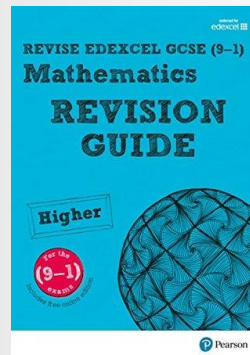
