Headteacher Message

This week we had our first positive pupil case of Covid-19 and I am pleased to report that action was quickly taken to minimise risk to everyone on site as soon as we received the call. I would like to reassure all parents that we have a robust system for identifying pupils who need to self isolate - in this case pupils were identified on Class Charts seating plans and were sent home with both hard copies of work and online learning via Google Classroom. We also sent home pupils who had been identified as mixing socially at break and lunch. I am confident that ou school environment is as safe as it can be, with masks enforced in all communa areas and year groups not allowed to mix. Pupils are washing their hands upon entering the building and their classrooms every time they move around.



KS3 Curriculum Intent - Performing at maximum levels

Pupils are learning to develop physical literacy through running, jumping and throwing based athletic events.

KS3 lessons

Pupils across years 7-9 have been busy completing their athletics and fitness units of work this half term. Athletics lessons have been centred on running, jumping and throwing disciplines with some excellent individual performances along the way! Pupils have been able to develop their knowledge of technique across all events, and will take place in a mini sports day event in preparation for assessment week next week. Where additional fitness lessons have taken place, pupils have experienced the different ways training can be adapted to enhance athletic performance, through developing speed, strength and explosive power.



KS4 Curriculum Intent: Sports Studies

Pupils will explore a range of issues in sport, relating to participation barriers, the promotion of values and ethical behaviour through highprofile sporting events and national governing bodies.

KS4 PE -Sports Studies

All Y10 and Y11 pupils on the Sport pathway are currently preparing for their examination for unit R051 – Contemporary Issues in Sport. We are really pleased with the progress pupils are making within lessons, with high quality work and knowledge being demonstrated. The topics covered so far have fuelled some fantastic discussions on issues such as barriers to participation and different user groups within sport. This continued effort and engagement during lessons will really stand pupils in good stead for their January exam!



KS4 Curriculum Intent: GCSE PE

Fitness testing and training: Pupils to know the relationship between health and fitness, and the role that exercise plays in both.

Our Y11 pupils have also been working really hard bringing themselves back up to speed with their course. They have been busy finishing off unit 1 content which looks at types of training. Pupils have demonstrated a really impressive attitude so far within lessons, especially when completing some red zone activities. During these parts of lessons, pupils work independently to complete more challenging tasks – such as end of topic tests and exam- style questions. Pupils will shortly be making initial preparations towards their NEA coursework and practical moderations.






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Logging on to Google Classroom




Logging on to Google Drive


If you are happy that the task is complete – click 'Hand In'. Your teacher will now be able to see and mark your work before returning it to you.



Logging on to Google Drive

Step 1

If you have signed into Google Classroom first and you cannot access or attach your work you may need to sign into Google Drive. The steps to do this are below.



- If you are working from an iPad, an iPhone or an Android tablet or Android mobile phone we recommend you download the apps: Google Classroom, Google Drive, Google Docs, Sheets and Slides as this will keep you signed in and will allow documents to open with the correct app for editing.
- If you are using a school provided Chromebook, once you are signed in you won't need to sign in to Google Classroom separately as you will already be signed in to your Moodle account to access the device.
- If you are using an iPad and iPhone we suggest you download Google Chrome browser instead of using Safari.

Teaching and Learning Highlights

This week pupils have been using personalised formative assessment on Google Classroom. Staff have used 'Private Comments' and the 'Add Comment' functions to give pupils individual feedback on their Photography and Graphics work. Awarding marks using the GCSE marking scheme has been powerful and pupil's have understood how they can improve to gain more marks.

Our Year 11 Art pupils have begun their personal projects for their main Unit of coursework. All 55 pupils in Y11 are working on a chosen area of Art. Here is a stunning example from Abi Aspinall.
