
Faculty of the Week: Art & Technology


Well done to all Year 11s working so hard to get the best grade they can!











Teaching and Learning - Resource of the Week

Reference: @mrfitzhist

Purpose: The Trivial Pursuit Pie promotes both speed and accuracy in terms of knowledge recall. Both of which are enhanced via this competitive format. Pupils respond to three questions per piece of pie, if all are deemed correct then they can colour the piece in as won.

How to use: The format encourages competition, fast but accurate recall and can be tailored in terms of quality requirements.

STEP 1: Pupils race to answer the three questions connected to each piece of pie. Once completed they have this checked by the teacher.


STEP 2: If answers are considered to be good, then the pupil is allowed to colour this piece of pie in. Once the whole pie is completed, whoever is first wins.

Where does it fit in the 5 Phase Lesson plan: This is a great ENTRY task and gives all abilities something to get stuck into. It would work really well as a think pair share or you may even build this in as a scaffold during guided application if pupils are struggling individually.

Outcomes:

- Knowledge recall
- Consolidation of content
- Formative assessment
- Highlighting of misconceptions
- Improved responses
- Tailored expectations

Teaching and Learning - Checking for Understanding

Topic: Checking for understanding

Here are some the of the techniques staff having been using over the last week to check for pupils understanding in lessons.

Show Call: This is like cold calling except students have to show their work or demonstrate their understanding in a more extended manner and open it up to critique from the rest of the class. If combined with a 'teach it back' approach, it's possible to get a good sense of whether students are learning. There are lots of other forms of questioning too – and the more students who are engaged in giving responses, the better.

There are various whole class response methods:

Show me boards/white boards: Used well these are brilliant for getting a sense of early stage grasp of an idea or for revision. They can capture diagrams, bullet points and calculations. You can see everyone's answer at once.

Choral call and response: You can't gauge precise levels of understanding but you can ensure all students are engaged in the beginnings of a recall process as they practise eg in MFL or learning quotations or equations.

There are various peer to peer rehearsal strategies that involve all students but then feed into a sampling process that is based on cold call but where everyone has rehearsed their answers which is part of the process of building their understanding and recall.

Paired instruction: Like TPS above but where students take turns to walk through an explanatory sequence, 'teaching' a concept to their partner without supporting notes.

Different forms of knowledge will lend themselves to some methods more than others but it's got to be a basic routine that we place as much emphasis on checking as we do on our instructional output.





Update of School Nurse Sessions in School

Due to recent school closures and the ongoing Covid-19 restrictions we have been unable to offer Year 8 and 9, HPV immunisations and school nurse drop in sessions in school, but we are happy to inform you that these sessions will now re-commence in school over the next few months.

Year 10, Diphtheria/Tetanus & Polio and Meningitis ACWY sessions will commence and will be held in local clinics and other identified venues over late summer term and the Summer holidays, if held at clinic a letter will be sent out to invite children to attend, with details of dates, times and venue.

Please be aware that our School Nurses will be implementing full social distancing and infection control measures, in order to protect your child. All our staff will be wearing face masks (in line with government guidance).

To ensure the safety of your child and our staff we ask that if your child or anyone in your family has a high temperature, a new and continuous cough, loss or change to sense of smell or taste or have been told to self-isolate you do not attend for the appointment or session.

School Nurse drop in will resume in September fully, but school nurses will regularly liaise with schools over any children needing support. Do not hesitate to contact the School Nurse Team for any further information, on the contact details below.
