Headteacher Message


It was wonderful to see so many of our pupils and staff today in their christmas jumpers and festive accessories to raise money for the Save the Children charity.



Excellent work this week from Year 10 and Year 11 BTEC DIT classes.






Year 9 Art - Amazing Insects!

<u>Literacy Challenge - Chanukah</u>

Chanukah also spelled **Hanukkah** and known as the **Festival of Lights**, is an eight-day **Jewish holiday** commemorating the re-dedication of the Holy Temple (the Second Temple) in Jerusalem at the time of the Maccabean Revolt of the 2nd century BCE. Hanukkah (Hebrew: מַנֶּה, usually spelled חנוכה pronounced [χanuˈka] in Modern Hebrew, also romanized as Chanukah or Chanuka), is observed for eight nights and days. According to the Hebrew calendar, it starts on the 25th day of Kislev, which may occur from late November to late December in the Gregorian calendar.every year since 2001 on 26 September - together with the European Commission.


Book of the Week

This week I'm recommending a group of books that I think have been a really useful addition to our library. This is the Barrington Stoke, 'Super Readable' collection.

These are quite short books written for teenage readers, often dealing with difficult issues which people sometimes have to deal with. What makes these books special, though, is that they have been specially adapted to help readers with dyslexia. They are printed on cream paper, using a font which is more accessible to those with dyslexia, as the letters are more widely spaced and clearly formed, so if you're struggling with dancing letters, it's worth giving these a try!

An example is 'Senseless' by Steve Cole, the author of the 'Young Bond' series:

It's a dream come true - Kenzie has been invited to a big international gaming tournament on a sun-soaked island. But then unreality ratchets up with disturbing scenes involving other contestants, soldiers and frantic chases through the hotel. Worst of all, Kenzie seems to be losing his senses one by one - and he has no idea whether the dangers he faces are real or the game.






Support from schools


