SCIENCE

Half term one in Science!

<u>KS3</u>

Welcome to the new year 7's, and welcome back to all the other year groups. It is fantastic to see the hard working attitude you have all returned to school with!

This half term year 7 have been learning about Lab safety, science skills and have just started studying cells too.

So far we have all earned our Bunsen burner licence and have started to learn about how Scientists carry out their investigations.

In year 8 the students have been learning about diet and digestion and how enzymes break down our food.

Year 9 have been studying light and sound waves and we used our reading strategies to understand an article on noise pollution. We have just started thinking about what causes differences between living things and are learning about genetic and environmental inheritance.

Key Stage 4

Year 10 have been studying States of Matter, Forces and Cells, they have made an excellent start to their GCSE course.

Year 11 continue to work hard towards their final exams. All students have been studying radioactivity and the dangers caused by radiation. Students used a random coin toss experiment to show the random nature of radioactive decay.

Revision classes have begun on a thursday lunchtime and many students have taken advantage of the extra time offered by teachers.



- Why is it important to understand different forms of communication?


BOOK OF THE WEEK: ARTEMIS FOWL





STANDARDS AND EXPECTATIONS

At Dean Trust Rose Bridge, we believe that the standards of personal appearance are reflected in the attitudes of our pupils. If pupils need to bring a mobile phone to school to ensure their safety when travelling, they must be handed in at the start of the day, before entering the building.

Sanctions will be applied to any pupil who fails to meet the school's standards and expectations.

Top Tips for Parents and Carers

Have a look at the tips and links below with some suggestions on how to get you started and help you to stay safe and positive online. You and your family can #PlayYourPart in creating a better internet by...

Having conversations without judgement.

Whether by playing games, watching videos, or doing things your child enjoys, spending time together online is a great way to start conversations about the online world and how they're finding being a part of it.

It is important to ask questions and take an interest in what your child enjoys online. An essential part of having this open dialogue is to not judge, even if their behaviour or life online isn't what you wanted or expected. This ensures that your child feels they can come to you if ever they make a mistake or experience a problem online.

Knowing where you can learn more about their favourite apps and games.

Websites like Common Sense Media or The Family Gaming Database can be invaluable sources of information. When your child starts talking about a new game or app, why not do some research into the reporting and blocking options available? Then you can help your child if they come to you with an issue.

Getting support if things go wrong.

There are lots of organisations who are there to support you and your family if something has gone wrong. The Report Harmful Content website can help you with issues such as cyberbullying, impersonation and threats. You can report worrying behaviour towards children to CEOP. Find out more on Children's Get Help page.

Reassuring your child that whatever happens online, you are there to support them.

Let your child know that the best way to address any problem they have online, is to tell a trusted adult immediately. For example, this might include someone sending them a friend request; an online message; telling them to visit a specific website, or app; or asking them for their personal information. Reassure them that if anything happens online that they are unsure about, or makes them feel worried or upset, they can come to you for help.
